Recent Open Doors:

Over the past year, the Lord has upended our previous expectations of what role my family would take in the ministry, allowing us to travel internationally more than we ever anticipated. These last few months were no exception. The second week of October launched us into a month of opportunities, starting with our flying back to the States. We arrived in WA on an invite from our home church for its annual mission’s conference. We are overwhelmed at His providence and the generosity of our church family, as funds were raised for further development of the conference center.

Two short weeks later, my family was on a plane once again, our destination León, Mexico. Last year I was involved in a pastors’ training conference there (which is very similar to the one we host at our facilities), and this time the Lord allowed our entire family to attend, as well as a staff team from our home church. I was privileged to teach several sessions over familial relationships and the Biblical philosophy of music, and my family helped with registration, sound system set-up, music specials, and orchestra. A week later, our team drove to a church just outside the city limits which was celebrating its anniversary, and we were a part of the preaching and music.

Upcoming Projects/Events:

As always, a myriad of construction projects remains on the horizon. As we slowly make our way through the lengthy list of tasks, it has been made clearer than ever that we are in desperate need of heavy construction vehicles. Due to the lack of this equipment, our two employees have been compelled to work solely on landscape and repairs, with no time for actual development. We also desperately need a perimeter fence and gate. Recently the female seminary students (who are located on site) were endangered by someone trying to break into the dormitory. We praise the Lord that they were unable to get in and the girls are unharmed. On the other hand, we have no way of discouraging burglary as our property is completely accessible from the surrounding area. As the facility is quite expansive, it will be very costly to raise a fence around the exterior, but it is vital that we have a way of keeping the students, ourselves, and all ministry supplies secure.

Prayer Requests:

- We continue to ask prayer for the salvation of Rigo and Enger and their families. During our staff meetings/devotional time, we have been teaching through the doctrine of salvation.
- We ask that you pray with us for God’s provision as we try to acquire several heavy pieces of construction equipment.
- We ask for prayer that sufficient funds will be provided to construct a perimeter fence/gate around the facility.

We thank you again for your faithful prayers and support, and we pray that God continues to use our family in unexpected ways.
